On the sixth day of September, 1620, just 300 years ago, the United States of America were born at Plymouth. The parents, sad-hearted and despondent fathers and mothers, were a hundred and two Conscientious Objectors—74 men and 28 women—who sailed in the Mayflower from Plymouth to find a refuge from persecution and a new home for freedom in another continent. So America was born, let us not forget it, from the sorrow and travail of British hearts.
