

Baynes Family Portraits,  
Bower House, Havering.

No list was received with the pictures from Messrs. Ilford Ltd., and since none of them bears either name or label, descriptive titles have been assigned in the following notes. The identification of subjects and artists in nos. 1-3 is based on information from Christopher Hussey's article "The Bower House, Havering, Essex - II" in Country Life, 24th March 1944, pp. 508-511. Pictures nos. 4-7 are presumably also of members of the Baynes family.

1. (Lady Picking Oranges),  
Lucy Baynes, daughter of John Baynes (no. 2). Hussey suggests Hogarth as the artist.
2. (Man in Red Robe),  
John Bynes, Sergeant at Law, builder of the house, Deputy Steward of the liberty, by John Vanderbank, (1694?-1739), painted 1727.
3. (Seated Woman),  
Mrs (Mary) Baynes, also by Vanderbank (1727).
4. Seated Women  
different subject from no. 3. ? Mary Baynes c. 1720
5. Man in Black with White Collar (? John Baynes in  
civilian dress, c. 1720
6. Girl in Gold Dress and Pink Cape c. 1690
7. Man with Cravat and Brown Cloak with Pointer c. 1690
