Licence and Faculty, as well to you *the Parties contracting*, as to the **RECTOR, VICAR,**
CURATE, or Minister, of *the aforesaid Parish* who is designed to solemnize
the Marriage between you, in the Manner and Form above specified, according to the Rites of
the Book of Common Prayer, set forth for that Purpose, by the Authority of Parliament.

of *September* in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-eight,
and in the Eleventh Year of our Translation.

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THE JUBILEE PAINTER.

The adjourned meeting of the creditors of George Frederick Francisco Sargent, the painter of the "Queen's Jubilee Garden Party," was held. It will be remembered that it transpired on the last occasion that the bankrupt had been engaged for three years painting the Jubilee Garden Party, he receiving advances in connection with the same from the Standard Life Office, there also being sureties, one of whom was Sir Heron Maxwell, and two other gentlemen. The debtor, examined as to the security held by the Standard Life Office said that it consisted of life policies as the bonds of the sureties. He further stated that Sir Heron Maxwell also held the picture plates copyrights and subscription list to secure his £850. He also considered that Mr. Macqueen held security of certain plates, one of which was Mr. Gladstone, another the Archbishop of Canterbury. Mr. Macqueen: I value those at about 10s. a plate for the copper. The bankrupt: But Mr. Gladstone is a valuable plate, I think. Mr. Macqueen: Well, I have had the plate some seven or eight years, and have not sold a copy of it. The Bankrupt: I have not had the plate to sell. Mr. Maxwell: I only value them at old copper price. In reply to further questions the bankrupt stated that the prints of the "Jubilee Garden Party" were thrown away under the distress for rent, fetching about 2s. a piece. Mr. Macqueen did not know of the sale, or they would not have gone at that price. After some further observations the chairman said that there was nothing to do but to pass the usual resolution for bankruptcy, with Mr. Deekes as trustee, with a committee of inspection. The unsecured debts are £2,911.
